WITH MANY of her paintings in the background Grifescoda Art Gallery, the young Catalan artist, Ma-ría Eugenia Tusquets, who has just inaugurated her exhibition, is in very inter-esting contrast to her work.

María Eugenia has several styles - expressionist, figurative, and one which curiously reminiscent of Fauvist School in France.

With her long blonde hair and intense eyes, she has both a far-away look and a present awareness of her life and art. At the same time, she was full of imagination, enthusiasm, and an exhilarating joie-de-vivre.

As I looked at her figures and landscapes, I was and landscapes, I was struck by her simplicity, realism, and profundity. I was intrigued, most of all, by her figures of nomadic Berbers and Arabs against

a desert landscape.

«Figures are far more expressive against a landscape,» the artist reflected. «I was especially fascinated by the natives during my travels in Morocco, Egypt,

Lebanon, and Israel.

«These lands are tota different from anything lands are totally have ever known. In these people, there is sadness, conformity, and fatalism to which we are not ac-customed in the Occidental world.

«Everything about them is different - their language, music, dances, costumes. music, dances, costumes. They have been able to keep their language, despite wars, conquests and revolutions, throughout the cent-uries. And their language is the language of our own St Augustine, who wrote his famous City of God in the fourth century.»

-Where did you find the Berber nomads in your pict-

ures?

«In southern Morocco on the fringe of the Sahara. Most of them are very poor, but they are very proud, in-dependent people, and the original inhabitants of North Africa.»

-How long have you been

painting?

«Professionally, three years, in individual and collective exhibitions. I began to paint ten years ago. Ever since I was a child, I wanted to be a painter.

«For me, incidentally, everything is based upon colour rather than form I

colour rather than form. am much more interested in

colour than form.

«At the moment, I painting abstracts, and I find that in these paintings without form, I am able to express many original ideas. This is quite an experience.'

«Admirable. The Majorcan school is famous, and their

use of colour is remarkable.»

«More dreamlike and imaginative pictures. But of course, I prefer to travel when I can. Wasn't it a great French writer who declared that one learned more

abroad in a single day than ten years at home? «I agree completely, and every time I trave!, I am so inspired and make so

many sketches that I have ideas for years to come!

But I am still evolving, as you can see. To me, painting is an expression of character, and when I find such faces as these Perhamber. such faces as these Berbers,

I am so happy!

«As for the others, between figures and landscapes, there is plenty of room for all kinds of expression. I've travelled widely over Eur-one and the Mediterranean, and keep making sketches for future paintings.

«Please don't look for unity in my work! But you will find that I am always serious, dedicated, and an artist who puts everything

into her painting.»
